ALSO PRESENT: Chief Marty Jensen, Chief Scott St. Martin, Chief Brandon Lyksett, John Nickleby, Kelli Espiritu, Trisha Turnquist, Rick Swanson, and Melanie Herberg.

A copy of the agenda was posted in City Hall lobbies, delivered to the Hudson Star-Observer, and mailed to committee members on February 10, 2016.

Alderperson Morrissette called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 14, 2016 MEETING: MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Morrissette to accept the minutes of the January 14, 2016 meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 6TH ANNUAL HALOS OF THE SAINT CROIX VALLEY 5K FAMILY FUN DAY IN LAKEFRONT PARK ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 6, 2016 AT 9:00 A.M.: Kelli Espiritu stated they may change the route to keep participants in the park. Chief Jensen stated there haven't been any issues in the past and a squad car will lead the runners. The runners will be on the street and the walkers on the sidewalk. Espiritu stated they will notify residents on First Street of the event.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Morrissette to recommend approval of the event as presented. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 2ND ANNUAL COLOR DASH IN LAKEFRONT PARK ON AUGUST 28, 2016 AT 10:00 A.M.: Trisha Turnquist stated they had about 500 participants last year and expect about the same. Jensen stated that there were no issues with the previous event. Morrissette requested that organizers notify the residents on First Street.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Morrissette to recommend approval of the event and for coordinators to notify residents. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON A REQUEST TO INSTALL (2) TWO 15-MINUTE PARKING SPACES ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF LOCUST STREET, WEST OF SECOND STREET: John Nickleby and Rick Swanson, owners of Erbert & Gerbert and Dunn Bros coffee will be opening a Dunn Bros at 529 2nd St, Suite 200. They are requesting two 15 minute parking spaces on Locust Street in the morning so customers can stop and be on their way quickly. Morrissette stated that with such limited parking downtown, perhaps one on Second Street and one on Locust Street. He asked what hours they were asking that the restriction be for. Swanson stated that they anticipate their busiest hours to be 5:30 a.m. to about 9:00 a.m. weekdays and maybe until 10:00 on weekends.

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MOTION by Morrisette to recommend one 15 minute parking space on Second Street and one 15 minute parking space on Locust Street.

Hall requested that the issue be revisited in six months.

Jensen stated that if there were one on Second Street, customers of other local businesses may begin to use it also. Morrisette stated that the sightline at this intersection may need to be addressed as well.

MOTION by Morrisette, SECOND by Hall to recommend approval of two 15-minute parking spaces on the south side of Locust Street, west of Second Street from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and to revisit the issue in six months. MOTION CARRIED.

EMS/FIRE DEPARTMENT/ POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES:

Chief Lyksett stated that Josh Olson has been selected as the Operations Supervisor.

They have been working on a plan for the new facility.

Chief St. Martin stated they have designed a Fire Prevention Checklist for property owners.

They have also developed a Violation(s) Correction Reply for property owners to certify corrections have been made for non egregious violations.

He has gotten positive feedback from businesses on the job that Mike Perucca is doing with the inspections.

They recently held their annual meeting and hired new officers.

St. Martin stated he's ready to talk about space needs and work together with the Committee and Council to solve those needs.

Chief Jensen stated that Samuel Welbourn has accepted the Patrol Officer position and will start next Wednesday. The background check is being finished on Charles Welbourn for the other position. Morrisette inquired if these brought the department to full staffing. Jensen stated that all the positions will be filled, but that the department is still short based on the state average.

Administration received training on the Lexipol system, which is a cloud based Policy & Procedure manual. It also incorporates a daily knowledge segment which can be used for up to 8 hours toward annual training requirements.

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Casanova at 5:30 p.m.

CONSIDERATION OF PARK BOARD MINUTES MOTION by Erickson, second by Brokaw to recommend approval of the January 12, 2016 Park Board minutes. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE HUDSON BOOSTERS PROPOSED BATTING CAGE FOR GRANDVIEW PARK Dave O'Brien, Hudson Boosters, provided a proposal to purchase and install a batting cage at Grandview Park ballfields. He noted the location is east of the facility and would not interfere with any activities. O'Brien stated the estimate costs associated with the installation of the batting cage, including the frame, netting and base is \$6,000. He noted all costs to be the responsibility of the Hudson Booster organization.

MOTION by Weiler, second by Erickson to approve the Hudson Boosters to purchase and install batting cages at Grandview Park. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE REQUEST BY ANNE WASMUND TO POST A SURVEY ON THE "SUPPORT A HUDSON DOG PARK" WEBSITE Anne Wasmund provided a draft of the survey related to a proposed dog park that has been posted on a Facebook page named "Support a Hudson Dog Park". She stated 850 responses have been collected to date and that information from the survey will be put towards the efforts to raise funds for a future dog park.

Zeuli stated the land at Prospect Park was partially funded through a DNR grant and that an answer on whether a dog park meets the requirements has not been received. He stated activities for the park must remain passive recreation.

Casanova suggested a link to the page be posted on the city website. It was noted that this may not meet the city policy for the website.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE REQUEST FROM THE GIGGLE FACTORY FOR USE OF LAKEFRONT PARK CONCESSIONS FOR 2016 SEASON Casanova stated the Giggle Factory is requesting use of the Lakefront Park concessions for 2016. He noted 5% of the revenue is paid towards use of the concessions area and the concessionaire pays the electricity per the lease agreement.

Erickson asked how much revenue is collected. It was noted the operations are weather dependent and average \$500 per season. The overall Board agreed the concessions is a positive addition to the area and that vandalism and other incidents have decreased since the operations were initiated several years back.

MOTION by Weiler, second by O'Keefe to extend the concessions lease with the Giggle Factory for the 2016 season beginning May 1, 2016 through October 1, 2016, weather permitting.
MOTION CARRIED.

REVIEW COSTS FOR ADDITIONAL LIGHTING AT VINE STREET SLEDDING HILL Zeuli stated an on-site meeting was held with Xcel Energy to review the lighting options for the Vine Street sledding hill. He noted the cost to install a light at 10th & Vine is \$231.27 with a monthly rate of \$12.00 month. In addition an increase in the wattage of the existing fixture could be increased from 39 watts to 65 watts for an additional cost of \$0.90 per month.

The overall Board agreed to the lighting improvements and also suggested the Public Safety Committee review the parking issues for the area and to consider making it "No Parking" on Vine Street between 10th & 11th Street. It was also suggested that each of the corners be posted "No parking her to corner" to eliminate cars parking to the corners.

MOTION by Erickson, second by Brokaw to recommend increasing the wattage of the existing light at the Vine Street sledding hill and to add an additional light on the pole at 10th and Vine Street and to recommend the Safety Committee to consider No Parking on Vine Street between 10th & 11th Street and also at each of the corners. MOTION CARRIED.

UPDATE: PARK NEEDS ASSESSMENT Zeuli stated a meeting is scheduled with SEH to discuss the estimated costs for a Park needs assessment. Noted a future dog park and Walnut Street bridge should be identified in the Outdoor Recreation Plan for possible DNR funding.

PROJECT UPDATE: PARKS DEPARTMENT Zeuli stated the pathway lighting in Lakefront Park were upgraded to LED. Noted the arch lighting is in need of repair once a funding source is identified.

Zeuli mentioned an organization who is interested in enchanting the shoreline along Lakefront Park with plantings of native wildflowers, grasses and tree. Noted more information will be provided at a later date.

Zeuli stated the ice rinks have been on and off all season due to weather conditions. He noted the renovations to the restrooms have received positive feedback.

MOTION by Brokaw, second by Weiler to adjourn the meeting. 6:05 p.m. MOTION CARRIED.

Dear Chief Jensen,

In connection with the YMCA of Hudson, Tri to Change the World Inc. (TCW) proposes to hold our 4th annual youth triathlon on Saturday, June 4, 2016 from 1-5 pm.

Youth will compete in three categories:

Beginning Youth (ages 5-8 at date of event)

Swim 50 yards
Bike 2 miles
Run .5 mile

Intermediate Youth (ages 9-12 at date of event)

Swim 100 yards
Bike 4 miles
Run 1 mile

Senior Youth (ages 13-16 at date of event)

Swim 200 yards
Bike 4 miles
Run 1.5 miles

TCW plans for approximately 30 adult volunteers to man the race course, and we anticipate registration to be between 50-75 youth. We have arranged for overflow parking at First Presbyterian Church of Hudson at 1901 Vine Street.

We would also like to request an officer in a squad car be present at the YMCA driveway to slow vehicle traffic during the race, as this is where the children will be "putting in" from the parking lot to the bike trail.

I have attached maps of the proposed routes. We have moved the senior run route off of Vine so that it is the same path as the beginner and intermediate route. The proposed bike route remains the same as last year.

We are writing this letter to you to request permission to hold a Walk/Run as part of an event we are organizing at Willow River Elementary on Saturday, April 30, 2016, known as "Celebrate Difference".

The 4th annual "Celebrate Difference 5k Walk/Run" is intended to serve two purposes:

- To bring families together to enjoy a walk or run while celebrating not only our friends, neighbors, students, etc. who live with autism spectrum disorder, but to celebrate how we are all different. Since April is Autism Awareness month, our main focus will be on bringing awareness and knowledge to our community about autism.

Run west on Walnut (the dike) and turn around at the end. There will also be a bake sale for participants after the Walk/Run.


Thank you again for your consideration. Hudson is a community that many families dealing with autism live. It will be a great celebration and bring awareness to the entire community.





