A copy of the agenda was posted in City Hall lobbies, delivered to the Hudson Star-Observer, and mailed to committee members on March 4, 2016.

Aldersperson Morrissette called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 11, 2016 MEETING: MOTION by Alms, SECOND by Morrissette to accept the minutes of the February 11, 2016 meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO RESTRICT PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF VINE STREET BETWEEN TENTH STREET AND ELEVENTH STREET AND ON TENTH STREET AND ELEVENTH STREET AT VINE STREET DURING WINTER MONTHS: Aldersperson Morrissette asked that this issue be postponed until Hall was present to speak to it.

Aldersperson Hall became present at 8:01 a.m.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 4<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL YMCA YOUTH TRIATHLON ON JUNE 4, 2016 AT 1:00 P.M. BEGINNING AND ENDING AT THE YMCA: Chief Jensen stated that participants will be on the walking paths and sidewalks. There have been no issues in the past and an officer will be positioned on Vine Street at Diamond Drive.

MOTION by Morrissette, SECOND by Alms to recommend approval of the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual YMCA Youth Triathlon on June 4, 2016 at 1:00 P.M. beginning and ending at the YMCA. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 4<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL CELEBRATE DIFFERENCE 5K RUN/WALK ON APRIL 30, 2016 AT 900 A.M. BEGINNING AND ENDING AT WILLOW RIVER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: Jensen stated that this was a fund raiser for Willow River Elementary special needs music therapy program. There have been no issues in the past and an officer will be positioned on Second Street at Saint Croix Street.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to recommend approval of the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Celebrate Difference 5K run/walk on April 30, 2016 at 9:00 a.m. beginning and ending at Willow River Elementary School. MOTION CARRIED.

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DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 6<sup>TH</sup> ANNUAL WALK MS ON APRIL 30, 2016 AT 11:00 A.M. BEGINNING AND ENDING AT HUDSON MIDDLE SCHOOL: Jensen stated that participants will cross Carmichael Road and then utilize the walking path and sidewalks.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to recommend approval of the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Walk MS on April 30, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. beginning and ending at Hudson Middle School. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT FUNDRAISER FOR WOUNDED WARRIORS AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF SECOND STREET AT VINE STREET AND ELEVENTH STREET AT COULEE ROAD: Morrissette asked that issue be postponed to when the requestor would be available.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO RESTRICT PARKING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF VINE STREET BETWEEN TENTH STREET AND ELEVENTH STREET AND ON TENTH STREET AND ELEVENTH STREET AT VINE STREET DURING WINTER MONTHS: Hall stated that the Parks Committee had concerns with sight lines when kids are sledding. Jensen stated that there have been no vehicle related incidents in the area. He also noted that restricting parking on Tenth Street would impact the residents that park here. He stated that additional lighting had been requested and there is No Parking on the south side of Vine Street in that area.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to postpone the issue to the October meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON SAFETY CONCERNS ON VINE STREET: Morrissette asked that the issue remain on the agenda until the Vine Street project is complete. Some previous suggestions were painting crosswalks and solar lighted signage. Hall stated that it is costly to retrofit some of these and felt it could be done during the street update.

Todd Stonestrom asked for clarification on the solar lights. Jensen stated that the pedestrian would push a button, which activates the flashing pedestrian lights. Stonestrom felt flashing signage would help at Ninth Street and Seventh Street since visibility is reduced going down the hill (west). He also noted that many kids cross Vine Street to one of the three schools north of Vine Street.

Kathryn Prost suggested that the No Parking at intersections be extended to allow for better sightlines. She will do another Traffic Tamers survey when the weather is better.

Sharon Buffington thanked the Committee for taking the time to address these issues and liked the idea of the flashing pedestrian crossing and speed signs and the improved sightlines.

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Marrian Webber asked if the City had considered widening Vine Street between Second and the Fourth Street. Morrisette stated that the Pastor at First Baptist Church wasn't willing to offset the sidewalk costs.

Morrisette stated that now was the time to install wiring for electronic signage.

MOTION by Morrisette, SECOND by Hall to forward the issue to Public Works recommending flashing pedestrian crossing signage on Vine Street at Ninth Street and possibly Fourth Street, and an electronic speed sign on westbound Vine Street at Ninth Street and improving the sightlines along the Vine Street corridor. MOTION CARRIED.

EMS/FIRE DEPARTMENT/ POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES:

Chief Lyksett stated that the new siren has shipped.

Chief Jensen stated that Charles Welbourn has accepted the Patrol Officer position and will start on March 30.

Administration is working on the Lexipol system, which is a cloud based Policy & Procedure manual. It also incorporates a daily knowledge segment which can be used for up to 8 hours toward annual training requirements.

The department will begin using web based scheduling software. This will allow employees to view the schedule from any device with internet service, request time off and receive electronic notification of changes. It will also allow the District Attorney viewing access for court scheduling purposes.

INFORMATION: None.

OTHER ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS: Morrisette-overhead lane indicator signage on Gateway Boulevard at Crest View Drive.

ADJOURNMENT: MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to adjourn. MOTION CARRIED.

## Attendance

The Locust Street Car & Motorcycle Shows would not be judged, but rather gatherings of all car/motorcycle enthusiasts. There would be no charge to enter the shows, or for the public to attend. The only criteria is that the cars/motocycle and/or trucks must be collectable/custom status.

## Parking

"NO PARKING AFTER 12:30pm" signs would be posted on meters by 9 am on the show days, and barricades and 2 garbage cans - provided by the city and left in the alley between Dilly Dally and Nutrition HQ - would be put in place at 1:00pm. Vehicles still remaining on the street would not be towed, but removed quickly by locating the owner. Parking is a "first come-first-serve" basis, with participants parking diagonally along both sides of the street - 50 to 80 cars and/or motorcycles maximum.

### Barricades

Barricades provided by the city will be placed as follows: 3<sup>rd</sup> and Locust – 1-2 barricades manned by two people to control car show traffic entering and exiting. **The only entrance will be at the intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Locust Street to avoid backing up 2<sup>nd</sup> Street traffic.**

2<sup>nd</sup> and Locust Street – 2 barricades manned by one person – only exiting.

Alley between Dilly Dally and Nutrition HQ – 1 barricade near the dumpsters, manned by one person. (People entering the alley from Walnut Street can use the Marnie Photography parking for a turnaround. Barricade located at the Locust Street entrance of Postmark Grille parking lot.

### Garbage

Garbage cans provided by the City, will be outside Nutrition HQ, and outside Knoke's Chocolates.

### Clean up

Cars and motorcycles must be parked in accordance to the law by 5:10pm and barricades will be removed, allowing Locust Street to be reopened. Garbage and signs will be removed by Locust Street retailers after closing.

Upon approval by the city to designate space at Prospect Park for a future dog park, the group plans to organize fundraising events, donations, etc. to pay for the fencing and other amenities for the dog park.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: To recommend approval of the wooded area along the westerly portion of Prospect Park for a dog park.


## Dog Park Proposal Update

- We met Tom Zeuli at Prospect Park on 8/4
- Details for Prospect Park Proposal included below
- We recognize that Weitkamp Park is no longer a potential location
- Fundraising events will commence once we determine a location

## Prospect Park

### Phase 1:

- Approximately 1500 ft. of 5ft. black vinyl fencing  
Approximate cost @ \$13.50 per foot installed = \$20,250 (potentially reduce costs by installing standard chain link in the wooded area)
- Establish trail (red) to connect to existing trail (blue)
- Water station
- Dog waste receptacle
- Signage
- Donation Box
- Dog waste baggie box (take a bag, leave a bag)
- Portable restroom
- 5 evergreen trees planted at corner of Wisconsin and Prospect
- Sign and Map depicting the existing trailhead near the shelter – sign will indicate it is **not** an off-leash trail (green)




Phase 2:

- Separate Small Dog Area (less than 30 pounds)
- 600 ft additional fencing @ \$13.50/ft = \$8,100.00
- Could be used for agility/obedience training classes (space rented by instructors)
- A second dog waste receptacle and signage

How often do you anticipate using a Hudson Dog Park?





Where is your primary residence?





How important is a separate small dog area to you?





## **NATURE-BASED OUTDOOR RECREATION**

### **Definition and Determining Eligibility**

51.002 (19), Wis. Admin. Code

“Nature-based outdoor recreation”, under s. 23.0917(4), Stats., means activities where the primary focus or purpose is the appreciation or enjoyment of nature. These activities may include but are not limited to hiking, bicycling, wildlife or nature observation, camping, nature study, fishing, hunting, picnicking, cross-country skiing, canoeing and multi-use trail activities. Support facilities for these activities may include but are not limited to access roads, parking areas, utility and sanitation systems, sanitary and shelter building, signs, interpretive items, and other features that enhance nature-based outdoor recreation or improved disabled accessibility. Ineligible activities include but are not limited to sports that require extensively developed open space such as dedicated sports fields, swimming pools and tennis courts.

Nature-based outdoor recreation is an eligibility requirement for the Stewardship Local Assistance Grant Programs (Acquisition & Development of Local Parks, Urban Greenspace, Urban Rivers, and Acquisition of Development Rights) and Department Development projects, including Grants for State Property Development.

Examples of eligible projects:

- Shelters, picnic facilities
- Interpretive Kiosks
- Trails - walking, hiking, biking, horseback, x-country skiing, multi-use
- Fishing & hunting facilities
- Nature Centers/Visitor Centers  
Observation & sightseeing facilities
- Camping support facilities
- Support facilities for swimming in a natural waterbody (lakes list) – beaches, swimming areas, bathhouses
- Habitat Restoration
- Permanent Landscaping
- Wood Sheds
- Fences & lighting for protection of users
- Signs

Determining Eligibility: Criteria for Evaluation

1. Do the project improvements have an expected useful life of 20 years or more?
2. Does the project support or create outdoor recreation activities?
3. Degree of engagement with nature; what is the user primarily engaged in – nature or equipment being used?
4. Degree of natural setting
5. Degree of modification to the natural environment
6. Attorneys should be consulted when controversial decisions are to be made.

Decisions as to whether a particular activity is “nature-based outdoor recreation” will be made on a case by case basis by applying the evaluation criteria listed above.

The Stewardship Advisory Council concurred with the procedure and agreed that there is no need to get their input on individual eligibility decisions. They would periodically like to be updated on the issue of "nature-based outdoor recreation".

**Determinations of whether specific activities/ facilities are NBOR**

1. Dog exercising areas – depends on size, activities likely to take place, etc.
2. Horse ring at camping area used for warming up horses before trail riding. Ok only if not used for events and very simple fence construction.
3. Land that would be used in part for a parking lot adjacent to a multi-purpose community boat launch. The parking lot was seen as supporting nature-based outdoor recreation – fishing, boating.
4. Development of man-made swimming pond – focus of Stew is on natural waterbodies. An artificial swimming pond/lake is too similar to a swimming pool in development, high cost, and large degree of modification of the natural environment.
5. Development of sledding hill w/ tow rope - no
7. Development of manmade ice rink - plumbing, ice rink mold, etc. – no
8. Development of Frisbee golf course – no
9. Playgrounds – no
10. Shooting Ranges - no

Dear Members of the Park Board,

Our names are Eric and Katherine VanSchoonhoven. As members of the Hudson community, and in particular as members who will soon be living very near Prospect Park at 607 Laurel Avenue, we want to express our desire that the city NOT approve a dog park on the site of the old hospital. Please bear with us as we express a few of the many reasons we oppose this venture.

Hudson does not need a dog park, especially at Prospect. Yes, there are people who take their dogs to this area to play. We believe permission to have animals in this area should be continued, and would like to see more done to combat the mass of thistles and other prickly plants prevalent in this field that could cause injury to people and pets. However, creating a dog park would take land away from the use of all residents, and would limit it only to the use of people who own dogs. The area for which the dog park is proposed is a beautiful area—a large grassy area where many residents go to play lacrosse, Frisbee, or just stroll. We know this because we go to or pass this park nearly every day. The side hill mentioned in the proposal is a forested area with walking paths that stretches down to Third Street, near downtown. It is a great “shortcut” for walking to local businesses and events downtown, and a favorite “adventure” of our children and others. In the years when the paths are cleaned up and new woodchips put down, it is one of the best places in Hudson. Even now, with residual damage from storms of the last few years, it is a great place where mossy logs span natural crevasses, trees arch over the walking paths, and people can crunch through ankle-deep oak leaves. We enjoy the wildlife in this tranquil area, and the polite, well-mannered residents we meet there. It is an idyllic spot, and we find it surprising that the DNR would say that unsightly chain-link fencing cutting through this area would be consistent with passive recreation. We doubt that this is the type of recreation for which the area was intended, regardless of official permissibility.

We disagree that Hudson needs a dog park, and believe it would cause more problems than it would solve. Most homeowners in Hudson have yards for their dogs; we are not a major metropolis where pets lack grass. Many of our local parks allow dogs. The people who want to meet others with dogs can do this, without taking away park land from others. The city allows homeowners to construct fencing, and many homeowners have installed invisible fencing, so many of Hudson’s dogs already get the opportunity to run off leash. Dogs at dog parks go through stress every time a new dog arrives; they need to establish their hierarchy at the dog park again and again, which leads to more instances of violence than are found among dogs who go to other parks. As mentioned in last week’s article in the Star Observer, the area mentioned really is not big enough for a true dog park, anyhow. Successful dog parks, like the one in Burnsville, are in excess of seven acres in size, which allows animals the space they need to play without becoming overly territorial.

While we have no doubt that volunteers would find funds to put up low-cost chain link fences, we believe that the area would quickly go “to the dogs”. The fencing would soon be overgrown, and chain link fences become less and less attractive with age. While at first there may be volunteers to help

clean up the park, soon it would become unsightly, and it would be very difficult to unmake the dog park once it was established. While at first volunteers might be around to monitor that only licensed, vaccinated, well-trained dogs are permitted in, this, too, would deteriorate, and the city certainly is not going to pay a trained monitor to be stationed full time to meet the promises made by the dog park proposal. Hudson already has a problem with residents keeping and walking dogs that are poorly trained, behind on vaccinations, and dangerous, as shown by bite attacks in the past two years against people and other dogs; we believe encouraging the congregation of dogs would exacerbate our existing dog problem.

We understand that the hospital site was not the original area for which the dog park was intended. We oppose having a dog park here for all the same reasons the residents near Weitkamp did not want a large portion of their park going to the use of dogs. We believe that the residents who want this park would not want it in their back yards. Our current level of cohabitation of people with dogs at Prospect is at or near optimal, and we are glad that the water fountain at Prospect Park includes a drinking station for dogs.

While we oppose a dog park at the old hospital site, there are a few things we would really like to see done to better utilize this area and the rest of Prospect Park. We believe Prospect Park would really benefit from the installation of approximately two more light poles along the road that winds the south and west side of the park, near the trees. We would like to see a drain in the field removed or covered; we've seen people fall here and one person twist their ankle. We would also love to see the stairs at the bottom of the hill replaced; the bottom steps are broken and others are decaying. It would be safer and easier for families with smaller children to traverse this area if they were repaired or replaced.

These are just a few of our many thoughts regarding why and how much we do not want to see a dog park at the old hospital site. Please feel free to contact us with any additional questions.
