PRESENT: Alderpersons Alms, Hall, and Morrissette.

ALSO PRESENT: Chief Marty Jensen, Chief Brandon Lyksett, Kelly Burrows, Angie Brown, Kelly Scribner, and Melanie Herberg.

A copy of the agenda was posted in City Hall lobbies, delivered to the Hudson Star-Observer, and mailed to committee members on June 7, 2016.

Alderman Morrissette called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall.

MINUTES OF THE April 14, 2016 MEETING: MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to accept the minutes of the April 14, 2016 meeting. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT RELAY FOR LIFE ON FRIDAY JUNE 24, 2016 AT 4:00 P.M. IN LAKEFRONT PARK: Kelly Burrows and Angie Brown stated that the opening ceremony is scheduled for 6:00 p.m. There will be a K9 demonstration, kids activities, food, an adult area, the luminary, live music and the closing ceremony will be at 11:30 p.m. Morrissette stated that the Council had approved the event, but it came back to Public Safety for more information on serving alcohol. Burrows stated that they are trying to expand their audience and participants. They have partnered with local businesses to have local products available. Jensen stated that this is the second year they have held the event in the park, but their first year serving alcohol. There will be an officer at the event 5:00 p.m. – 11:00 p.m. He stated that this is a family event.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to recommend approval to conduct Relay for Life event on Friday, June 24, 2016 at 4:00 p.m. to midnight in Lakefront Park. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT 11TH ANNUAL RAGNAR RELAY FOOT RACE ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY, AUGUST 12 AND 13, 2016 WITH STOPS AT RIVER CREST ELEMENTARY AND BIRKMOSE PARK: Jensen stated that the participants come through late at night. The Gopher to Badger race is the same morning, but the events don't overlap. The exchange will be in Birkmose Park, rather than Lakefront Park, but runners will still run through downtown. Morrissette advised participants and organizers to be careful with the construction in the area. Alms asked that a list of approved events be presented at the next meeting.

MOTION by Alms, SECOND by Hall to recommend approval to conduct 11th Annual Ragnar Relay foot race on Friday and Saturday, August 12 and 13, 2016 with stops at River Crest Elementary and Birkmose Park. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO CONDUCT FUNDRAISER FOR THE FISHER HOUSE: Kelly Scribner stated that Fisher House works with military families to provide lodging when service members are hospitalized. They plan to set up cones at a couple controlled intersections and have volunteers in vests approach vehicles stopped at red lights

asking for donations. Scribner stated that they have had great success with this approach in Indiana. Morrisette stated that he was inclined to deny the request due to the appearance of people approaching vehicles, traffic safety issues, and congestion; although the Committee agreed that the event was for a good cause.

MOTION by Morrisette, SECOND by Alms to deny the request, but for organizers to contact Parks and Public Works for ideas on conducting fundraising in a park. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO BLOCK WALNUT STREET BETWEEN FIRST AND SECOND STREET ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 13, 2016 FROM 8:00 A.M. TO 3:00 P.M. FOR THE 4TH ANNUAL BRIT FEST CAR SHOW: Jensen stated that this is the 4th annual event and that it has been a huge success. He stated that there haven't been any problems in the past and the roads will be open by then.

MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to recommend approval to block Walnut Street between First and Second Street on Saturday, August 13, 2016 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for the 4th annual Brit Fest Car Show. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO INSTALL A STOP OR YIELD SIGN ON PROMISE BOULEVARD AT PROMENADE: Alms stated that this is in the Heritage Green addition and there have been several near misses at the intersection. He noted the letter from Lindsay Dumond, who lives at the intersection. Three other neighbors have also voiced their concern. Jensen stated that he's spoken with Community Development Director Denny Darnold to have the developer look at this intersection and others. He stated it met the requirements for a yield sign. Hall agreed that a yield sign was a warranted.

MOTION by Alms, SECOND by Hall to recommend speaking with the developer to install a yield sign on Promenade at Promise Boulevard and for the developer to look at other intersections in the development. MOTION CARRIED.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON TRAFFIC SAFETY ISSUES ON VINE STREET: Morrisette asked that this issue be kept on the agenda until the construction is done. He stated that although it goes against the Stop and Yield Sign policy, he would like to explore the possibility of a stop sign on Vine Street at either Seventh Street or Ninth Street and asked that accident data at those two intersections be available at the next meeting. Jensen reiterated that stop and yield signs are to regulate right of way. Alms asked that the City monitor those intersections after the pedestrian crossing signs are installed before considering traffic control signs. Hall stated that other metro communities have had success with speed bumps and felt it was worth the committee's and Public Works consideration.

EMS/FIRE DEPARTMENT/ POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES:

Chief Lyksett stated that their license was renewed is good for two years.

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The Oak Street siren is installed and worked on battery power. It just needs the electrical to revert down to the proper voltage. Morrissette asked for an email what that was completed.

Chief Jensen stated that the final new officer has been hired, Kurt Devroy. The department has four officers in training. The two who were on sick leave are back on patrol.

The new squad to replace C115 has been ordered.

INFORMATION: Morrissette stated that there have been several calls on the two fawns on Crest View Drive by the old Perkins building.

OTHER ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS: None.

ADJOURNMENT: MOTION by Hall, SECOND by Alms to adjourn. MOTION CARRIED.
