INTRODUCTION

The Hudson Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee was established on March 30, 2015 by Ordinance 2-15. As per Municipal Code § 212-13, the purpose of the Advisory Committee is to make recommendations to the Hudson Plan Commission, and, as appropriate, to the Public Works Committee, Public Safety Committee, and the Park Board regarding cycling and pedestrian issues affecting the City of Hudson.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE MISSION

The mission of the Hudson Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee is to make pedestrian and bicycle activities safe and accessible for all while improving the operation of pedestrian and bicycle facilities.

OBJECTIVES

The Hudson Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee has identified the following objectives:

Goal 1. Development

To increase bicycling and walking opportunities that meet the needs of all residents for residents and enhance tourism and the economy of the City of Hudson

Goal 2. Maintenance

To maintain bicycle and pedestrian networks including streets, intersections and other physical improvements.

Goal 3. Encouragement

To promote the use of bicycle and pedestrian modes as elements of an integrated multi-modal transportation system within the city of Hudson and St. Croix County.

Goal 4. Safety

To promote a safe bicycling and walking environment in the City of Hudson through facility improvements, education and enforcement programs.

Goal 5. Administration

To make recommendations to the Plan Commission and other Committees as necessary regarding opportunities for bicycle and pedestrian network improvement.

Goal 6. Funding

To identify and obtain funding to support bicycle and pedestrian projects and opportunities.

Goal 7. Partnership

To encourage and participate in intergovernmental and public/private cooperation and coordination on cycling and pedestrian matters.
